A team representing the Higher Learning Commission is recommending continuing accreditation for Eastern New Mexico University-Roswell, with the next comprehensive evaluation visit scheduled for 2027-2028. The team visited the campus April 24-26 to review the institution's ongoing ability to meet HLC's Criteria for Accreditation. Eastern New Mexico University-Roswell has been accredited by the HLC since 1971. Its accreditation is at the Associate's degree level.

In preparation for this evaluation by its regional accrediting agency, ENMU-Roswell engaged in a process of self-study, addressing the Commission's requirements and criteria for accreditation. "This comprehensive evaluation visit was a rewarding experience for our campus and for the community members who also participated," said Dr. John Madden, President. "We had an excellent team and the visit was a learning process for our employees as well. We identified areas where we can improve and we received feedback from the team on how to build on our strengths. We appreciate the wonderful support we received from the community and business leaders who met with the accreditation team and we will move forward providing quality education and services to our students," said Madden.

The Higher Learning Commission is an independent corporation founded in 1895 as one of six regional institutional accreditors in the United States. HLC accredits degree-granting postsecondary educational institutions in a nineteen state region.

PROFESSIONAL PILOT TRAINING AT ENMU-R



ENMU-Roswell is accepting students for its new Professional Pilot Training Program. The campus has acquired a plane to be used exclusively for beginning pilot training and the media is invited to attend a photo op/information event with instructors and students on Wednesday, October 18 at 2:30 p.m. Media representatives will be escorted from the Aviation Maintenance Technology Center at 12 W. Challenger to the ramp where the plane is located.

The Professional Pilot Training (PPT) program at ENMU-Roswell is a two year Associate of Science degree program. Students will complete a comprehensive core of both academic courses and degree specific training. After earning the degree, graduates will have the private, commercial, instrument, and instructor licensures needed to acquire the flight hours to become Airline Transport Pilots. Students will begin training right away in a Cessna 172SP with a full instrument cluster for instrument flight training and autopilot. Students will find that flight training in Roswell provides wide open air space in mainly ideal weather and flying conditions. SECURITY UPDATE

Thanksgiving Safety

- 1. Thanksgiving is the peak day for home cooking fires, followed by Christmas Day and Christmas Eve.
- 2. Stay in the kitchen when you are cooking on the stovetop so you can keep an eye on the food.



- 3. Keep children away from the stove. The stove will be hot and kids should stay 3 feet away.
- Make sure kids stay away from hot food and liquids. The steam or splash from vegetables, gravy or coffee could cause serious burns.
- 5. Keep the floor clear so you don't trip over kids, toys, pocketbooks or bags.
- 6. Keep knives out of the reach of children.
- Be sure electric cords from an electric knife, coffee maker, plate warmer or mixer are not dangling off the counter within easy reach of a child.
- Keep matches and utility lighters out of the reach of children — up high in a locked cabinet.
- 9. Never leave children alone in room with a lit candle.
- Make sure your smoke alarms are working. Test them by pushing the test button.

ENMU-Roswell is proud to announce that Dr. Peter M. Dittmer, Chief Pilot for the Professional Pilot Program, has earned accreditation as a Master Flight Instructor with the National Association of Flight Instructors (NAFI). This is Dittmer's fourth NAFI Master Instructor accreditation.

Dittmer has a Ph.D. in Education and holds an Airline Transport Pilot Certificate, as well as a "Gold Seal" Flight Instructor Certificate for instrument single and multiengine aircraft. Dittmer has been teaching college level classes and instructing in both flight and ground classes for more than 27 years.

A NASA Faculty Fellowship recipient, Dittmer spent two summers at Edwards Air Force Base designing curriculum to train mission managers. He is also a past recipient of the Flight Instructor of the Year Award for the Southwest Region. He is active with aviation organizations including University Aviation Association, NAFI, Civil Air Patrol, Virginia Space Grant Consortium, and has over 8,000 hours of instruction given. His says his wife of 28 years, Sondra, has been a great sport, supporting his "passion" that became a "profession."

The NAFI Master Flight Instructor Accreditation is earned by aviation educators based upon a system of advanced professional standards and peer review. The accreditation identifies and publicly recognizes those teachers of flight who demonstrate an ongoing commitment to excellence, professional growth, and service to the aviation community. The NAFI Master Instructor accreditation is for two years and may be used to renew an FAA flight instructor certificate. Applicants must have been a CFI for two years and have given 1,000 hours of flight instruction. In addition, candidates must meet and document activity in four NAFI Master Instructor categories (Instructor, Educator, Service to the Aviation Community, and Professional Activity).
