SIXTY-NINTH COMMENCEMENT

More than 200 candidates for graduation are expected to participate in Eastern New Mexico University-Roswell's Sixty-Ninth Commencement Convocation. The ceremony is scheduled for **Friday**, **May 11 at 6 p.m. at the Roswell Wool Bowl**. Bachelor's and master's degree candidates from ENMU will also participate in the ceremony.

The commencement speaker will be candidate for graduation, Mariah Dutchover. With her graduation from ENMU-Roswell, Dutchover is carrying on a family tradition. Her mother, Irma, graduated from the Occupational Therapy Assistant program in 2011 and her sister, Miranda, received an associate degree in Emergency Medical Services in 2015. Dutchover is receiving an Associate of Arts in Business Administration.

In "The Upstarts: How Uber, Airbnb, and the Killer Companies of the New Silicon Valley Are Changing the World" author Brad Stone (senior executive editor of global technology at Bloomberg News) chronicles the lives and visions of Travis Kalanick of Uber and Brian Chesky of Airbnb. He describes how they have rewritten the rules of business and how they have often side-stepped ethical and legal issues in the process. Stone has covered Silicon Valley for almost twenty years. His book is an enjoyable, compelling read for anyone who is interested in businesses and how they are created.



Uber Technologies Inc. is a peer-to-peer ridesharing, food delivery, and transportation network company headquartered in San Francisco, California, with operations in 633 cities worldwide.

Airbnb is an American company which operates an online marketplace and hospitality service for people to lease or rent short-term lodging including holiday cottages, apartments, homestays, hostel beds, or hotel rooms. The company has over 4 million lodging listings in 65,000 cities and 191 countries and has facilitated over 260 million check-ins.
