Tax Year 2022 Filing Thresholds by Filing Status

Filing Status	Taxpayer age at the end of 2022	A taxpayer must file a return if their gross income was at least:
single	under 65	\$12,950
single	65 or older	\$14,700
head of household	under 65	\$19,400
head of household	65 or older	\$21,150
married filing jointly	under 65 (both spouses)	\$25,900
married filing jointly	65 or older (one spouse)	\$27,300
married filing jointly	65 or older (both spouses)	\$28,700
married filing separately	any age	\$5
qualifying surviving spouse	under 65	\$25,900
qualifying surviving spouse	65 or older	\$27,300
