I. Area Reports

a. Dr. Devin Stroman

j. Dr. Edna Yokum

- 1. We received a 61% HiSET pass rate for New Mexico Youth ChalleNGE. They still have another cycle to retest if they would like. The goal is 60%.
- 2. We were recently ranked the third-largest Adult Ed program in the state. We are usually number four.
- 3. We have a 74% intention rate, 4% above the state benchmark.
- 4. We 103 students since July 1 have passed at least one exam, and 70 students have passed and earned their HiSET and GED.
- 5. Matt Rincon will attend the Journey to Literacy information luncheon on January 5. He has been asked to be a panelist to talk about the role of Adult Ed in Artesia.
- 6. I submitted the last purchase order for the Air Pistol Club. When that comes in, we will be ready to rock & roll with the Air Pistol Club. We are asking for your input on ideas for the location for a range. The original location is no longer an option.
- 7. The Kubota tractor has been delivered, and we are waiting on the John Deere tractor.
- 8. Snap-On equipment has been delivered to Automotive so students can start earning their NC3 Certification next semester.
- 9. Erubiel and Jonathan are working towards the ASC Accreditation for Automotive program.
- 10. Aviation Maintenance- The FAA came 2 weeks ago with no significant findings.

- 11. HVAC- all new equipment has been delivered and installed and is being used in the brand-new HVAC lab. This coming semester, students will start working on their NC Certs. The 2024 Annual Report for accreditation has been submitted.
- 12. Spring enrollment for Ag is up by 40% (2 students). Welding degree is up 54% (grew from 23 to 36 students).
- 13. December 11 at 6 pm, we will be having a Tech Ed advisory meeting in the auto welding shop.

- 1. The art and photography show is tomorrow in the Arts and Sciences building. It is the first time we have combined the fine arts with media arts, and we will continue to do this.
